THE PRESIDENT'S NEW YEAR MESSAGE 2020

I will take this opportunity to wish you all a Happy New Year and hope that 2020 will be a great year in Tennis for all of our constituents.

"What kind of man would live where there is no daring? I don't believe in taking foolish chances, but nothing can be accomplished without taking any chance at all..." to quote Charles Augustus Lindbergh, American Aviator, author, inventor and activist.

Our similar bold tennis advocate, International Tennis Federation (ITF) President, Mr David Haggerty was re-elected for a second four- year term in Lisbon, Portugal in September last year. He had successfully engaged member nations during his first term by attending all the Regional AGMs and listening to their concerns and needs. The number of nations represented on ITF committees and commissions was also increased by over 75% and subsidies were put in place to encourage more nations to attend the ITF AGM in 2019.

There was also a successful implementation of Davis Cup and Fed Cup reforms which unlocked US\$25 million in new funding that was distributed to member nations in 2019. As a result, the promise to double development spending was realised.

Tennis must continue to be a leader in integrity. The Barbados Tennis Association, as an important stakeholder, must continue to work on the Tennis Anti-Doping and Anti-Corruption programmes with the assistance of the ITF's Integrity Unit, to ensure that what happens in the boardroom, meeting room and on the court is above reproach and also embraces the comprehensive policies to safeguard both children and adults.

The ITF is committed to safeguarding all children and adults throughout tennis tournaments, events, projects and programmes at all levels. Embedding safeguarding best practices in all activities is key to achieving the ambitious goal of "Delivering Tennis for future generations". In addition, all members should note that there are set procedures for reporting concerns, recognising types/indicators of concerns and managing reports, allegations and whistleblowing. Do let me know if you have concerns in these areas.

Tennis in Barbados had moderate success during 2019 when compared to other sports. There were a few encouraging results on the junior tournament circuit as Hannah Chambers and Kaipo Marshall won ITF Grade 5 singles events in St Lucia and St Vincent, and St Vincent respectively. There were also doubles title winners and finalists in some of these ITF junior events as well.

THE PRESIDENT'S NEW YEAR MESSAGE 2020

Our number one ranked professional player, Darian King was not able to add to his tally of ATP Challenger Singles titles in 2019, but he did win two doubles titles during the year, and as a result reached a career high in doubles of #156. He also narrowly missed out on qualifying for Grand Slam main draw births in Australia and the United States, and with other good wins, he ended 2019 ranked at #166.

Once again coverage of many local events in the printed press proved challenging, in spite of reports and results regularly submitted. There were no home Davis Cup ties held during the year but we had a very hard away tie against Brazil last September. However, two international junior events were staged in Barbados; an ITF Grade 4 tournament in April and an ITF Grade 5 tournament in October which gave our local juniors opportunities to gain ranking points.

It is noted that the new focus of the Barbados Olympic Association to fund a smaller pool of athletes so that the elite tier could access greater financing, will no doubt have a deleterious effect on many emerging athletes.

The Association is still awaiting a meeting with the National Sports Council to understand the latter's new focus. No funding was sourced in 2019 from this entity towards any emerging athletes or any traditional team events, (ITF or COTECC - Central American and Caribbean Tennis Confederation), which the Association takes part in annually. The Association therefore had to rely on other Grants, Donations and Fund Raising events to finance many projects during the year.

"We Gatherin' Barbados 2020" is a national event to attract visitors to our shores, with aims to motivate entrepreneurship in all eleven parishes and various communities. Hopefully it will stimulate the economic growth of the nation as well as culture and sport, including tennis. However, all sports are judged by their results whether on the local, regional or international arena and without the necessary financial resources, progress will always be limited. It is obvious from the aforementioned and the continuing challenging economic climate, that the Barbados Tennis Association can no longer rely on its traditional partners and must find new funding alternatives.

I therefore ask all Members who have ideas to increase the Association's revenue during 2020 to come forward to assist us with realising our visions, continuing our mandate to develop the Sport of Tennis at all levels in the island, as well as maintaining the prominence of our sport during this new decade.

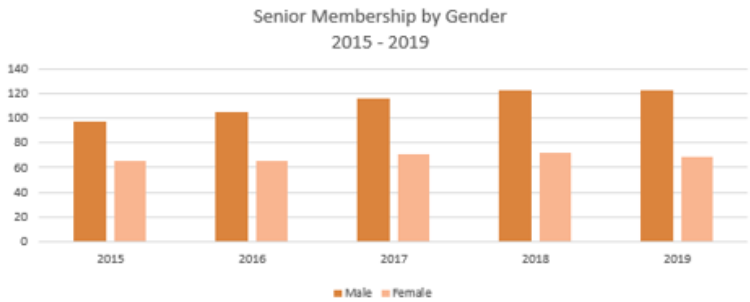
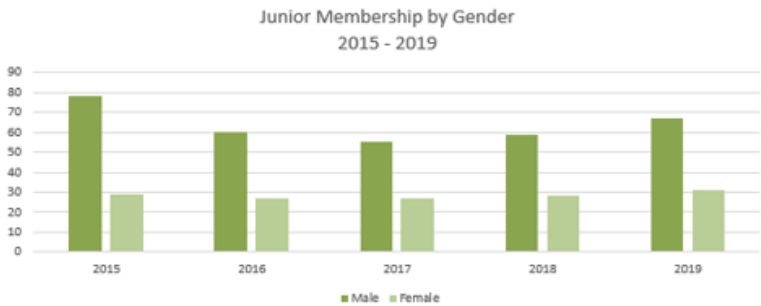

NATIONAL TENNIS CENTRE

The National Tennis Centre presently has four (4) courts and a small Club House. During the year under review, new lights were installed on one of the courts (Court 4). With all four courts outfitted with lights, the BTA can benefit from maximum rental and usage of the courts for night tennis as well as tournament play. The new tent installed over the temporary bleachers (between Courts 1 and 2) was a welcome reprieve for parents of the JTI players as well as the spectators during our tournaments.

In June 2019 the BTA advertised for the Facilities Coordinator role, a job which entailed managing the activities at the National Tennis Centre which included, but are not limited to, court scheduling, fee collection, overseeing the general maintenance and repairs of the facilities, marketing the tennis facilities/clinics and coaching sessions to members and assisting with tournaments and other tennis related events. Mr. Rand St. John was the successful applicant and started, and was responsible for the day to day running of the Centre, reporting to Council on a regular basis.

Efforts and preparation continue to expand to the originally envisaged a seven (7) court facility. The donating charity continues to engage and remains willing to assist in funding the completion of the NTC expansion. The expanded facility will allow the BTA to continue to improve the quality of developmental programmes and contribute significantly to the achievement of promoting Tennis in Barbados.

Beyond being able to meet the demands for additional court availability, it also creates greater opportunities for Barbados to host more regional and international events, thereby allowing local juniors greater access and exposure to overseas players, at much less cost.

JUNIOR TENNIS INITIATIVE PROGRAMME

The Junior Tennis Initiative offers a Daytime Primary School Under 10 Programme and an After-School Programme (The National Junior Development Programme), both of which are held at the National Tennis Centre. The National Junior Development Programme, run by Simply Tennis, resumed on January 7th 2019 at the National Tennis Centre, offering Student Tennis Initiative (STI), Performance Tennis Initiative (PTI) and the High-Performance Tennis Programme. Effective July 2019 the management arrangement with Simply Tennis however ceased and the BTA introduced a new and exciting tennis programme designed for players of every ability between the ages of 4 - 15 years old.

The new programme was launched in September 2019 led by a highly qualified and experienced team.

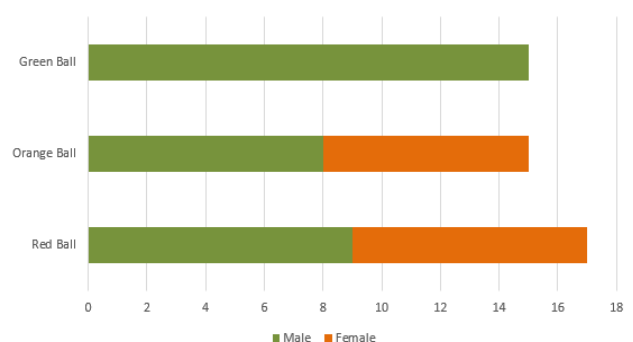

JUNIOR TENNIS INITIATIVE PROGRAMME

Sol Barbados has kindly supported the Daytime Primary School Under 10 Programme for the past six years, with Coaches Julian Baird and Christian Maxwell providing an introduction to tennis, to children from the neighbouring schools of **Blackman and Gollop**, **Grantley Prescod** and **Luther Thorne**. The groups met once a week, for 1 and a half hours, throughout the school terms, with each school bringing a class of 25 children aged 6-9 years old to the National Tennis Centre, courtesy of the BOA bus.

At the end of the year, a fun competition was held between the 3 schools and as a result of this programme, many children have fed into the After-School Programme also held at the NTC.

The JTI team also visited and provided demonstrations in the following schools between September and December 2019:

TENNIS10S

Three (3) Tennis10s events were hosted during 2019 on March 31, June 23, and December 1, where children ages 10 and under competed in red, orange and green Ball categories. The events were supported by a total of fifty-five (55) players during the year, hailing from various coaching camps across Barbados including: the BTA's JTI Programme, ATS, Smash Tennis, MD Tennis, Simply Tennis, Ocean View, and KandiCrush.

Overall, there were twice as many boys competing than girls. 15 players played in all three events, of which 3 were girls. All 3 girls moved from competing in red ball category to orange ball category by the end of the year.

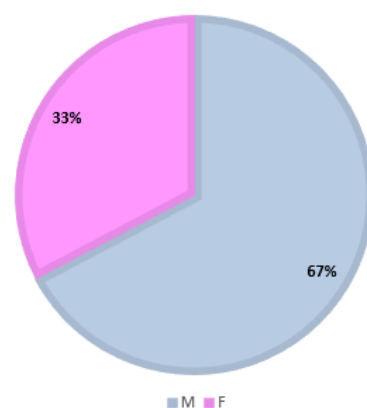

On average, 31 players participated in each event.

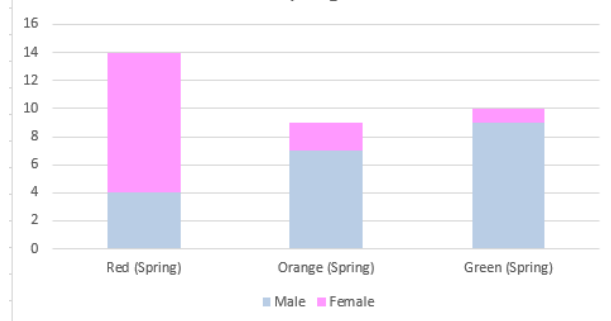

During the year, one only girl competed in the male dominated green ball category.

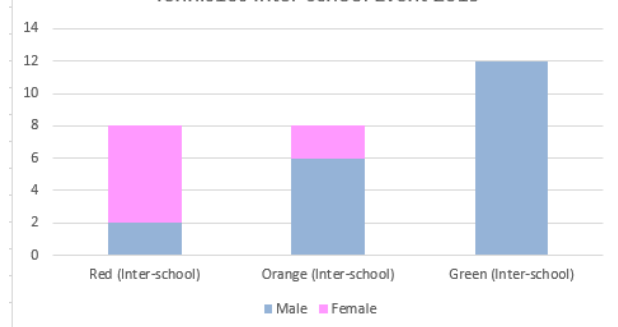
TENNIS10S 2019
MALES VS FEMALES



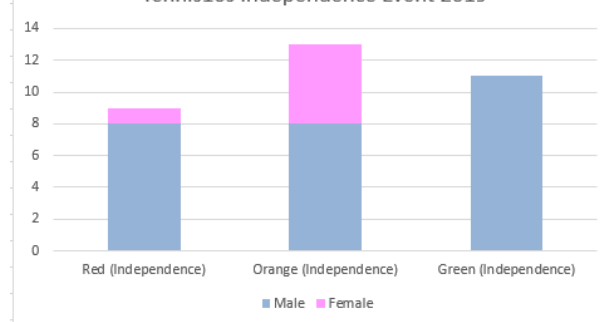
Tennis10s Spring Event 2019

The 18th Annual National Senior Games (NSG) were launched on April 20 2019 by Ministers John King and Cynthia Forde, the ministers responsible Sport and for People Empowerment and Elder Affairs, respectively. A Press Conference was held to discuss the activities, where athletes aged 40 years and over represented 15 disciplines.



The NSG started with lawn tennis at the National Tennis Centre between May 2nd and 16th. The categories included Ladies 45 doubles, Men's 60 singles, Men's 45 doubles, Men's 55 doubles and Men's 60 doubles.



Participation and results in the National Senior Games and the BTA's Barbados Tennis Nationals are used by Coaching Advisory Committee (CAC) to make recommendations to the Executive Council on the composition of the team chosen to representative Barbados at the Huntsman World Senior Games[1]. The WSG are typically held in Utah each October, with categories start from Over 50s and up. Barbados has consistently medaled in the mens' singles and/or doubles since 2011, when Dr. Forde and the late George Grant each received bronze medals for their singles performance in their respective categories as well as their doubles. the effervescent duo, who were regular players on the local senior circuit transformed to gold when they returned in 2012 and 2013. Between 2014 and 2017 Dr. Forde and Craig Smith brought home six (6) gold medals and one (1) silver. Of those two golds were for their doubles performance. In the past funding of the team has been provided by the Ministry of People Empowerment & Elder Affairs. Barbados last participated in 2017.

DAVIS CUP GROUP I CRICIUMA, BRAZIL 13 – 14 SEP, 2019

Effective from 2019 major changes were made to the format of the Davis Cup Ties, in particular:

1. The event was played over two (2) days as opposed to three (3),
2. The matches were based on the best of three (3) sets rather than five (5).
3. From 2020 Groups 1 & 2 at Zone level were discontinued and all related countries formed part of the wider “World Group”.

Under this new format, The World Group finals took place at one location in one week, with eighteen teams divided in six round-robin groups of three teams each, and with the winners of the groups and the two best second places advancing to quarterfinals. Since there were no demotions from the World Group with the change in format, Barbados remained in Group 1.

The Barbados team for the Brazil tie comprised of players Darian King, Haydn Lewis and Xavier Lawrence and was captained by Damien Applewhaite. Vice President King represented the President at Davis Cup event played in Florianopolis Brazil in September 2019.

#54 ranked Barbados had a tough draw, matched against the much higher #26 ranked Brazilian team in the tie, in the Americas Zone, Group 1.

Barbados has definitely benefited and continues to benefit significantly from the dedication and consistent support and contribution of its #1 and #2 seeds, Darian and Haydn, who have represented Barbados at the Davis Cup since 2009 and 2002 respectively. However, despite Barbados winning one of the matches (Darian King vs Joao Menezes 3-6,6-4,6-2) the new format of playing doubles and reverse singles on Day 2 was a challenge for our three (3) player team. A deeper pool of players is needed.

In recent years the BTA has systematically sought to increase the depth and experience of the pool of top players to complement Darian King and Haydn Lewis, Davis Cup teams have included players such as Matthew Foster-Estwick, Kaipo Marshall, Xavier Lawrence, and Stephen Slocombe. There are obvious challenges in having most of these players located overseas, however the BTA remains committed to the continued promotion of the Davis Cup Team and to a development strategy aimed at widening and maintaining the base of high level players. With continued collaboration with the Davis Cup captain, Barbados will ultimately be better able to harness and build on the growing talent of junior players.

FED CUP GROUP II PERU 15-21 APR 2019

Tangia Riley-Codrington, Chloe Weekes, and Melena Lopez, captained by Coach Andrew Thornton represented Barbados at the FED Cup Team competition held at Tennis Club Las Terrazas Miraflores in Peru.

The team was ranked #6 out of 6 teams, and despite difficult ties the young team gave a very credible performance against Bahamas, Trinidad and Panama.

It was encouraging that two junior players benefitted from the professional level tennis, absorbed the experience, and can potentially represent Barbados going forward. Greater experience and preparation on clay would have been an asset.

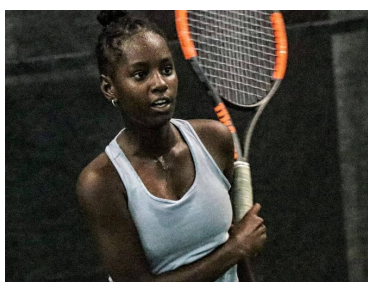

JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENTS



Many of our juniors participated in the U14 & U18 TFCOTECC events held in St. Lucia, St. Vincent, Trinidad & Antigua in the summer of 2019.

Hannah Chambers and Kaipo Marshall won ITF U18 titles, they are the only two players to win a title in singles for Barbados since Darian King, some 10 years ago.

Hannah Chambers at 15 years old won 2 back to back singles titles in the St. Lucia and St. Vincent ITF's U18 tournaments. She reached a career high ranking of #414 on August 19, 2019. Kaipo Marshall joined Hannah as an ITF singles winner in the St. Vincent ITF where he also won the doubles title with his partner, Stephen Slocombe. Kaipo reached a career high ranking of #622 on August 26, 2019.



As a result of her ranking and age, Hannah Chambers was invited by (and accepted) the International Tennis Federation to participate in the ITF Central American and Caribbean Junior Touring Team to travel to the COSAT (South America) U18 Circuit events to play 2 Grade 2's and one Grade 3 in Peru & Bolivia, which took place in November 2019. The Grand Slam Development Fund part-financed this project. Hannah and her partner were finalists in the Grade 3 doubles. Andreas Bernes was the touring coach.

This is an excellent example of opportunities available to our players who play and excel in their age groups. We encourage players to play their age group in local and regional tournaments so as to maximise on these opportunities.



ATP PROFESSIONAL

DARIAN KING

Darian had another successful year on the professional circuit in 2019 ending the year with ATP singles rankings of #166 and doubles rankings of #184.

He again qualified for each of the four Grand Slam events and at both the Australian and US Open, he reached the final round of the qualies only narrowly missing out on the main draw of each event.

In early 2019, Darian reached his only Challenger singles final in Orlando during the year, but his best performances came in doubles where he won Challenger titles in Fairfield and Winnipeg and was runner up in both Tiburon and Indian Wells.

He also qualified for the ATP 250 main draw in Delray Beach.

In Davis Cup against Brazil, he beat the PANAM Games winner Joao Menenez in singles and he and partner Haydn Lewis took World top 20 players # Marcelo Melo and Bruno Soares to two very close sets during the tie which Barbados lost 1-3.

JTI Coordinator Coach Thornton also attended a special 1-day JTI meeting held on the 24th for JTI coordinators all over the world. Coach Applewhaite attended a 1-day tutors' course update being conducted for those who conduct coaches courses and act as tutors.

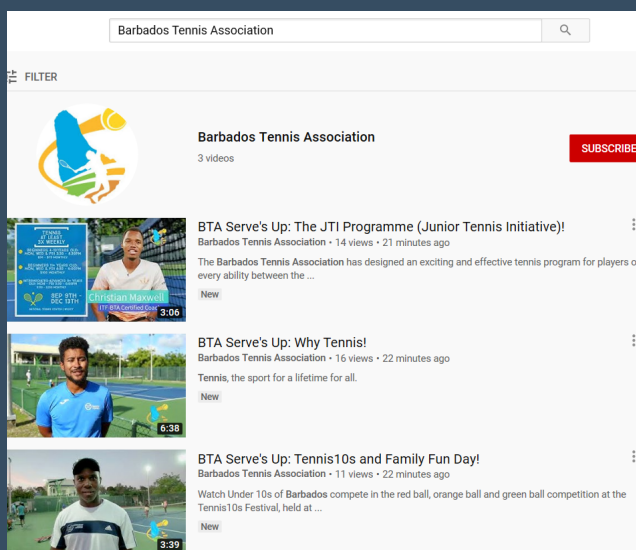
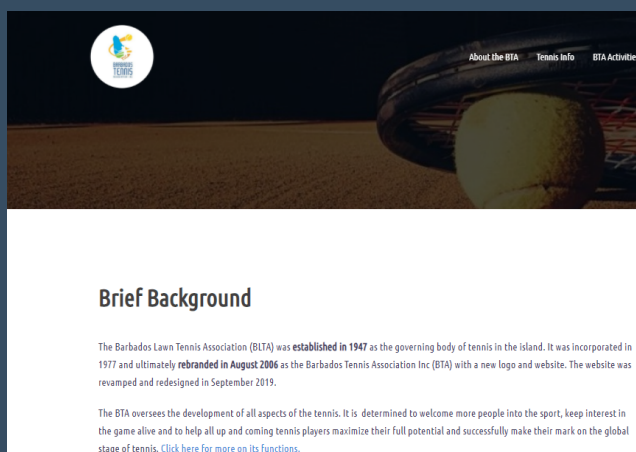


NEW INITIATIVES STARTED
